Minister's Moment

First, our 50th anniversary is only a month away! Invitations to former members and others have gone out, and plans are well underway. See the schedule of events elsewhere in this newsletter. Our former Associate Ministers, Mark Benson and Amanda Hines, will be with us, and at the Friday dinner will be sharing their memories their time with us. We have already heard from some of our former members that they will be joining us for all or part of the weekend. And our Memorials Committee has purchased a special something which will serve as a memento of the occasion. It's going to be a big time!

Remember that during August you need to do three things:

- Order your 50th anniversary apparel by August 5th to guarantee you have it for the anniversary weekend. There is a table in the gathering area that shows all the items that are available for purchase. You can order apparel after August 5th, but we can't guarantee that you will have it by September 7.
- Buy your tickets to the Friday dinner in the fellowship hall. They cost \$15/person if you are 13 years of age or older, \$10 if you're 5-12, and free if you're under 5 (but you still need a ticket, so we'll know how many people to expect).
- Sign up for the Sunday lunch!. Anonymous donors are covering the cost, but we have to know how many people to expect. The reservation sheet will be making the rounds with the attendance sheet on Sundays in August, or you can call in your reservation to the church office.

Meanwhile back at the ranch, work on the elevator is progressing. In fact, as I write this (August 1), they are beginning to install the elevator itself. It turns out that there are a lot of steps in this process; digging a pit below the bottom floor, cutting a hole in the upper level floor, reinforcing the remaining floor, building new walls, putting up sheetrock and painting the new walls, installing lights in the entryways on both levels, doing the electrical and mechanical work, and more. That's why it's taking several months. But they continue to tell us that it will be complete by September 7!

And here's the update on the other facilities improvement projects. Next up is the new nurseries. Recall that we are unable to combine our existing nurseries into one room because the walls separating them have to remain where they are because they lead to a fire exit. So plan B is to use the former handbell room and the southeast corner room. The project will include installing two new bathrooms, one for the nurseries and one which will be accessible from the area outside the downstairs classrooms. Our Mission

Minister's Moment, continued

Ken BeCraft and Clyde Smith are donating a great deal of what is needed, but the estimated cost is still \$15,000. We have to tear down a wall and rebuild a shorter wall, install a gate in the wall, take out a door, build walls for the bathrooms, etc. At the moment we have about half of that \$15,000 in pledges. In other words, the total of pledges received for our facilities improvements is \$90,000, and the cost of the elevator is \$83,500. So we need another \$7-8,000 to do the nursery project.

Then, next on the list is new youth rooms. The good news there is that we can use the current nursery rooms, making the expense to convert them to vouth rooms minimal. Some furniture and perhaps flooring and we'll be in business. That means we will not need to spend money reworking the annex (which was plan A for a CYF, i.e. senior high, room). It also looks like we will not need a new storage building, saving us yet more expense. That leaves the addition of a screen or screens in the sanctuary, camera and connections to the gathering area, fellowship hall, and nursery, which will cost \$14,000.

We're making progress! Keep in mind that pledges to the facilities improvements can be paid through the end of 2019. By then, might we have all the projects checked off the list? I hope so.

fund, to pay the difference between cash received and the cost of the elevator. As capital campaign pledges are received, the funds will be replaced in the general fund.

The original list of projects included refurbing the annex and adding a new storage building. Because of the change in plans for the nurseries, freeing up the existing two nursery rooms, we will not do any work on the annex. The existing nursery rooms will become the ChiRho (middle school) and CYF (high school) youth rooms. Additionally, it looks like we will have adequate storage space in our current buildings, eliminating the need for another building.



Reflections on Memories of the History of TCC by Preston Davis

Early in 1967– Four churches in District 5 decided that they needed a new church in the Timberlake area.

<u>Late in 1967</u>— They formed a Steering Committee, set up a Membership Charter and started meeting at Brookville High School Auditorium. Virginia Christian Missionary Society bought us land where Big Lots is now but it was decided later that we should go further out West. We sold the property and bought land on 460 from John Hicks, Sr. , father of our John Hicks.

July 1,1968- Rev. Jack Johnson came from Roanoke to organize the new congregation.

<u>Fall of 1969</u> - Hurricane Camille hit Nelson County very hard. So much rain fell on this area in such a short period of time that all the soil and vegetation fell from the rock base of one or more mountains rising up form the Tye River. All of this water and debris took out everything in its path as it rushed down the Tye River. Many people lost their lives in the hurricane.

The District 5 Men's Fellowship met, heard about the damage done to Evergreen Christian Church located on one of the upper forks of the Tye River and decided to go to work. Later, different groups made plans to work together on the repairs.

The church floor and pews caved in as the foundation was washed away. The unattached bathroom, known as the "Johnny" house was also washed away. Our church chose to work on replacing the "Johnny" house. We contacted the Agriculture Department, who sent us plans for building a "Johnny" house. We put the "house" on the bank near running water, by the river.

We put a spring on the seat cover to have it come down as one left the "house" as the plan called for. When we came back the next weekend, the spring was gone!

One weekend several men helped deliver food to some of the church members. One senior member thanked us and apologized to Rev. Jack Johnson because her dress didn't cover her ankles completely.

The ministers involved were Jack Johnson, Rucker Johnson, Dave Cheverton, Jack Hamilton and the minister of the Evergreen Church, St. John Coleman. There may be more ministers that I do not remember.

Kay Green's father, Lem Bennington, and his men painted the repaired church.

We continued to go there mainly on weekends until they got back on their feet, or in this case, back on their foundation.

October 8, 1972 — The groundbreaking.

June 24, 1973 — First service was held in the new building built by Bernard Gibson.

September 9, 1973 – Dedication of the new building

May 1974 - Steeple put on the church.

<u>October 1982</u>— We experimented with some non-structured services at an early time slot. There were 4 or 5 couples who met each week to plan services. One was a patriotic service. Our daughter, Pam Staton, was in Jazz band at Heritage High. She had them come and play patriotic songs. Two more were the "The Gospel Train" and "Turn Your Radio On". We did this until it became too time consuming in planning.

<u>Unknown date</u>—The men at Timberlake rented a floor buffing machine and attempted to strip and wax the fellowship hall one Saturday. No one knew how to operate the machine and it had a mind of its own. Joe Palmer (Hazel's husband and Joyce Mays' father) said "let me ride on it and you all guide it. That was fit for "Candid Camera"! This was long before Dale Maddox.

<u>Unknown date</u>— One Sunday as Sunday School let out, Rev. Jack Johnson said he had a bad case of laryngitis and might not make it through his sermon. Joe Palmer said "Don't worry Jack, Preston will come up and fill in for you. Sure enough, Jack's voice gave out and he called me up. I read his notes and figured what he would say. He stood beside the pulpit with help as needed. We did okay, I think.

<u>Unknown Date</u>- One of our District 5 church's missions was the Wood Ministry. Many groups gave us wood and our volunteers cut it up and split it. They had an old one ton truck that the volunteers delivered the wood with. Howard Lucas, a State Police First Sergeant, and Rev. Jack Johnson were delivering wood when Jack noticed the inspection sticker had expired a year or more before. Howard said, "Boy this doesn't look good!"

We are always helping and having fun too!


