## Minister's Moment

As I write this we're in the middle of Vacation Bible School, and we are having a great time on the Rolling River Rampage! There's a good group of young 'uns coming every night, and they're having a big time with a Bible story, singing, making things, snacks, and a little recreation. A big thank you to all who have stepped up to help make it a special week.

Next, in case you haven't noticed, we're missing the shelf in the narthex (the churchy term for the room just outside the sanctuary). It used to be beside the water fountain, but it's gone! The reason is the elevator installers have cut out what used to be the wall behind the shelf. That will be the upstairs access to the elevator. We're told that the elevator itself should be arriving in July. If you want to get a peek at what's going on, go in the room downstairs across from the bottom of the stairs that come down from the narthex.

The next project is new nurseries! Work should begin soon in what used to be the handbell room and the southeast corner Sunday School room. They may not be completed in time for the anniversary, but everyone will be able to see work in progress.

Because this "plan B" will create vacancies in the current nurseries, the Facilities Implementation Team is considering using those rooms as our new youth rooms. This means we would not upgrade the annex, leaving it for storage and for use by Preston's Fine Bluegrass Group (not their official name, but I think it has a good ring to it). That in turn means we might not need to purchase an additional storage building. Let me or Ann or a member of the team know what you think about that idea.

Once we knock down those dominos we get to the sanctuary video screen or screens/camera/connection to the gathering area, fellowship hall and nursery. We're received two bids for this big project, both coming in at around \$14,000. All we need is the money! The team is working on a way to carve that amount into smaller pieces, which we can give. We would then keep track of those gifts until we arrive at the total we need. Stay tuned for more info. And many, many thanks for your generous gifts to date for our improvement projects.

Speaking of our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, plans are looking good for the weekend of September 7-9. We will begin with dinner in the fellowship hall on Friday night. We have a confirmation that Mark and LeAnne Benson will be with us, and we are waiting to hear from other possible special guests. That evening we will "look back" at our history and have fun reminiscing. Tickets will go on sale soon.

Saturday we will have an open house from 2-4, where you will get to take a ride in the elevator(!), tour our facilities, and learn about our mission work. So that day we will highlight "looking at the present."

Sunday will be a particularly special day. The theme for the day is "looking ahead." However, we will begin with a bit of step back. Most of you know that TCC began its life with weekly worship in the Brookville High School auditorium. Well, we're headed back there for worship on the 9<sup>th</sup>! We will gather there at 10:30am, hear from our Transitional Regional Minister and TCC member Coretha Loughridge, and then gather back at "our place" for lunch.

So, exciting times are upon us and ahead! Stay tuned, and I look forward to seeing you soon.





Bob and Ann will be offering training for people for volunteer to greet people before the 8:45am and 11am service. We will offer 2 opportunities to attend training for each service.




All Church Picnic! Sunday, July 15 5pm

### 12 Years a Slave Screening Sunday, July 22 6pm Fellowship Hall

(rain date on July 29...if we have the All Church Picnic on July 22)

It has been said that "Until the lion learns how to write every story will glorify the hunter." Historical accounts of the Civil War have been researched and claimed by many in the last 150 years. One "real time" account from that era has resurfaced recently and offers documentary detail and chilling confrontation of the glamor tales of the genteel and glorious south... and north.

*12 Years a Slave* recounts the author's life story as a free black man from the North who was kidnapped and sold into slavery in the pre-Civil War South.

The son of an emancipated slave, Northup was born free. He lived, worked, and married in upstate New York, where his family resided. He was a multifaceted laborer and also an accomplished violin player. In 1841, two con men offered him lucrative work playing fiddle in a circus, so he traveled with them to Washington, D.C., where he was drugged, kidnapped, and subsequently sold as a slave into the Red River region of Louisiana. For the next twelve years he survived as the human property of several different slave masters, with the bulk of his bondage lived under the cruel ownership of a southern planter named Edwin Epps. In January 1853, Northup was finally freed by Northern friends who came to his rescue. He returned home to his family in New York and there, with the help of editor David Wilson, wrote his account in *12 Years a Slave*.


## Youth News
