Minister's Moment

First, thank you to all who helped make our 50th anniversary celebration a great weekend. Elsewhere in this newsletter we are attempting to list the names of everyone who helped in some way or other. Please forgive us if we left off your name. A <u>lot</u> of people contributed in a <u>lot</u> of different ways with the various events we conducted. Again, thank you!

I keep hearing from people, both church members and former members/others about what a wonderful time it was. For me, it was so good to see the Bensons, Amanda Hines, and various former members. And it was good to "christen" our elevator and begin to think about where we go from here as a congregation. I hope you share my warm feeling about the anniversary weekend.

And remember that you can order a book which will contain "Hazel's history", Mark's and Amada's remarks on Friday night, Coretha's Sunday sermon, and the "memories" we have received from you. Also available is a dvd of Friday night and Sunday worship. The books and dvds are \$5 each. Contact Ann. Quickly.

Meanwhile back at the ranch, you may have heard that there is big news on the facilities improvement front. We have received a significant challenge gift toward the projector/screen/etc. project. The plan is to install a projector and screen in the sanctuary, similar to what we have in the fellowship hall. This will allow us to have announcements, sermon slides, words to hymns, and other parts of the worship service on the screen. We will also install a projector on the back wall so that the choir and ministers see what everyone else is seeing.

Likewise included is a camera, which will be connected to the screen in the gathering area and the screen in the fellowship hall. Thus, when we have overflow from the sanctuary for a funeral or other service, people seated in either place will be able to see and hear what is happening in the sanctuary. We will also have a feed going to a tv in the nursery, so that the nursery workers can keep track of what's going on upstairs.

The total cost of all of the above is about \$14,000, which includes purchasing a computer and software to run the sanctuary video. The challenge gift is \$9,000, leaving the rest of us to give \$5,000.

In the grand scheme of things, we are at \$100,000 toward our goal of \$117,000 to complete <u>all</u> of the projects on the list. We have enough to begin work on the new nurseries, but will need the other \$17,000 to complete that project, the sanctuary/gathering area/fellowship hall work, and the conversion of the current nurseries into youth rooms. We've made great progress! And the goal is in sight. Keep in mind that we designed this as a two year campaign, so that pledges can be paid through the end of 2019.

Part of the answer to the question, "Where do we go from here?" is the updating of our facilities. We are very fortunate to have the buildings we have, and it is important that we keep them looking good and functioning well to meet the needs of our congregation today and in years to come.

So thank you for your gifts to this campaign to date. Keep them coming! It will be exciting to be able to say, we have arrived!, we have checked off everything on the list.

Since August we have been experimenting with the early service starting at 9:30 instead of 8:45. We planned to see how August went then develop a path forward. We felt that there were some good points and the trial was worth further consideration through September.

At the last elder's meeting this topic was thoroughly discussed, both positives and negatives. One big positive that most elders heard were comments that a significant number of people like the fellowship time with attendees of the other service. There was a consensus that we don't want to change just for the sake of change but there was a general feeling that there were more positive comments than negative and that a more thorough trial is justified.

It is our feeling that the trial should continue through the end of the year. This will be one of the busiest times of the year and should shed more light on benefits of the change and/or drawbacks associated with the change. In early January the decision should be made to finalize the time change or return to the old schedule.
