I'm going to spare you the details of what the new equipment in the sanctuary will do, because I've written and talked about it several times. The good news is that almost all of it is installed! What we need now is a few people willing to run the presentation software at our Sunday services. My thanks again to Robert Maslow for overseeing this project in a great way.

We will be using a program called Worship Extreme, which has online tutorials. Richard Jones and Ann are coordinating this effort, so please contact either one of them if you would like to look into being one of our operators. We will set up a schedule such that you not be committing to being the every week person. I've had a little preview of what this equipment will do, and I'm excited about getting it going, so please help out if you can.

Facilities improvement-wise, that leaves us with the new nursery and new youth rooms. Work has already begun on the new nursery, and as soon as it is complete, we can begin transforming the existing nurseries into Chi Rho (middle school) and CYF (senior high) rooms. So thank you for your donations and pledges to the capital campaign, and keep the gifts coming so that we can finish these projects in the near future.

Meanwhile, Lent begins on March 6. That evening we will have our Ash Wednesday service at 7:00 in the fellowship hall. Lent is the season of preparation for Easter, the forty days which remind us of


