I'm looking forward to it. All the questions and doubts (and "strife") that existed back before March 15 still linger. What's next? How long will we meet before Round Two hits and we have to go back to video streaming of worship?

Those questions no longer haunt me. This is the "new normal" everyone discusses. Restaurant owners ask the same questions. Shop owners, too. In reality, everyone does this as a normal thing now.

For churches, for pastors, for elders, for the Boards, for everyone, here is an important question: what if we don't follow the rules, and one of our elderly gets exposed by someone who doesn't know they were exposed to someone who has COVID-19, and they get sick, and others get sick, and people die? If we do not ask this question, then we are not asking the right questions anyway. This is the reason we stopped meeting back in March: to keep people safe. This is a constant struggle for church leadership. Be assured that we are moving as carefully as we can, with the best information we have available to us from the medical community.

Everything for June 14 hinges on there NOT being a huge spike in cases around us between now and then.

Starting Monday, June 1, we will begin sending out the guidelines for beginning to use the church building again. There will be emails with an attached document. There will be snail mail for those who do not use email. And I'm sure that some of you will get phone calls as well.

There will also be an article later in this newsletter with a few of those guidelines.

The main thing is this: we have continued to be the church during this time of physical distancing. We have remained faithful to each other. We have prayed for each other. We have worshipped in a new way. We have stuck together! We have done mission in spite of things.

I'm proud to be your pastor during this time. I'm proud to see what kind of people (and what kind people!) you are. The way ahead is not smooth by any means. We know now that we can handle it. Together. With God.

Mission Opportunity for TCC

Guidelines for Re-Opening the Church

The guidelines are based on the state's guidelines for gathering to the best of our knowledge. We realize that between now and June 14, or at any time after June 14, the guidelines may change, which means our guidelines will change in accordance with those of the state. The Elders met to go over these before they were sent to you. If you have questions, please call the office

- •When: June 14, as long as there is no a significant spike in COVID-19 cases in our area between now and then. If there is, we will let the congregation know and continue to do video worship.
- Masks are required. You can bring your own, or the church has both disposable and washable ones available. Put it on as you enter the church; you may remove it after you are outside.
- •Service times as of June 1, 2020: **8:30 AM**; **9:45 AM**; **11:00 AM**. (there will be time before each service to wipe down the sanctuary, public area, and restrooms.) Each service will last approximately 35 40 minutes. Each service will have the same format.
- •Please call the church office to make your reservation for the service you plan to attend. There will be a limit of 24 reservations per service, due to the need for ushers and worship leaders to have a place. We are maintaining a limit of around 30 people in the sanctuary at a time. Reservations are on a "first come, first served" basis.
- •Standing reservations may be placed with the church office if you decide you like the time of one service over another.
- •Ushers will guide people to seats. You probably will not get your favorite seat, for which we apologize in advance. We will maintain at least 6 feet between each group of worshippers.

- •Ushers will greet you, you will pick up your pre-packaged communion (we ordered this, so no one at church is handling your spiritual meal!).
- •You can make your offering as you enter or leave the sanctuary: there will be a basket marked "offering."
- •Ushers will have buckets for your communion leftover cup and plastic cover. Nothing may be passed from church member to church member.
- •No gathering inside the building for socializing before or after worship. "Keep Six Feet Between You" signs will be posted in several places.
- •People will need to make a reservation for the service they will attend. First come, first served, up to 30 people per service. If you have to cancel, please call the church as soon as you know this so that we can move someone into your spot if necessary.
- •There will be no singing. All the best evidence is that singing spews water particles farther than sneezing, which is bad enough! We may not be able to sing for a while, according to Ruth Foley. We will need to use pre-recorded music or the occasional live music as possible, with physical distancing observed.
- •Children must remain with parents during the service. There is not a safe way to do a nursery at this time. Children may not wander around without a parent.
- •No one with a fever or symptoms of COVID-19 is permitted to attend. This will also be posted on the front door. Please do not attend church if you are not feeling well.
- •Visitors: if there is space for them to sit, we will admit them. Otherwise, we will have to tell them what time there is space for them and ask them to return for that service. We realize that this is not the most welcoming of circumstances. It is perfectly permissible for a church member to give up their place at worship for a visitor: that is completely up to you.
- •Hymnals and Bibles and envelopes and other things have been removed from the pews.
- •Please observe all posted signage public health reminders regarding physical distancing, staying home if sick, and other things.
